



BAPPG Meeting Notes

Wednesday, December 6, 2017, 10am

1. Introductions and Announcements

2. Regional Board Announcements—Debbie Phan

- a. Debbie Phan requested that P2 reports from agencies include a Table of Contents, and have a length of less than one hundred pages, prior to any appendices.
- b. There is some uncertainty at the Water Board on managing and funding the Dr. Teng-Chung Wu Award in 2018. BACWA may cover the cost of the award.

3. Updates

- a. **Steering Committee** – The April meeting will be an OWOW training led by Annie Joseph, and the June meeting will be a four-hour community-based social marketing training. Staff from entities outside of BACWA will be invited to attend.
- b. **CWEA** –The annual CWEA P3S presentation will be in Riverside on February 12-14. The Redwood Empire section will be hosting a cannabis training on Feb 27.
- c. **BACWA** – BACWA’s Annual meeting was on January 19 and the presentations from the meeting are [posted](#). The SSS WDR will be reissued this year and the Collection Systems committee will form a subcommittee to deliver recommendations to the State Water Board.
- d. **Pesticides** – Dr. Moran is working on four pesticides letters.
- e. **Budget** – The committee budget is \$69,766, or approximately 70%, spent.
- f. **OWOW** – Contact Jennifer Kaiser for new OWOW materials. OSH has been a long time OWOW partner and is interested in creating their own product labeling.

4. Inedible Kitchen Grease Program Presentation

Michael Abbott gave a [presentation](#) on regulating restaurant grease haulers. Haulers must be permitted, and their trucks must be appropriately labeled with their certification. Michael gave an overview of ways to spot illegal haulers.

5. RMP CECs Update

Dr. Rebecca Sutton gave an [update](#) on the CECs projects that are ongoing through the RMP. They have recently drafted a manuscript on flame retardants, which reports that PBDEs are reducing in concentration following a ban on many products. There are some alternative flame retardants, such as triphenyl phosphate, which they are watching, since use is increasing, but more data is needed to assign a risk tier. PFOA and PFOS are both of concern, and agencies can look at electroplating facilities and firefighting foams as sources. There was a discussion that there needs to be better communication between the RMP and the Pollution Prevention community. Dr. Sutton also discussed the ongoing microplastics study.

6. Project Updates:

- a. **O'Rorke**- Univision failed to run the spots that were paid for, however they plan to make it up to BAPPG. Rather than running the 120 streaming spots which were of much lower value, they will run a week of 25 traditional radio spots valued at \$2,550. Production of the new spots using Toilets Aren't Trash Cans messaging will be free.

The plan is for one week of traditional radio spots, with 25 spots total, as follows:

- 15 :30 spots
- 10 :15 spots

O'Rorke's costs to write new scripts for these ads, supervise the radio recording process, manage and report out on this make-good would be approximately \$1,500.

- b. **Stephanie Hughes** – Stephanie is working on a presentation for veterinary associations on fipronil messaging.
- c. **Kelly Moran** – Dr. Moran is developing four pesticides comment letters.
- d. **BAPPG Support RFQs** – BACWA has [issued](#) three Requests for Qualifications for committee support. Submissions are due on Feb 15.
